

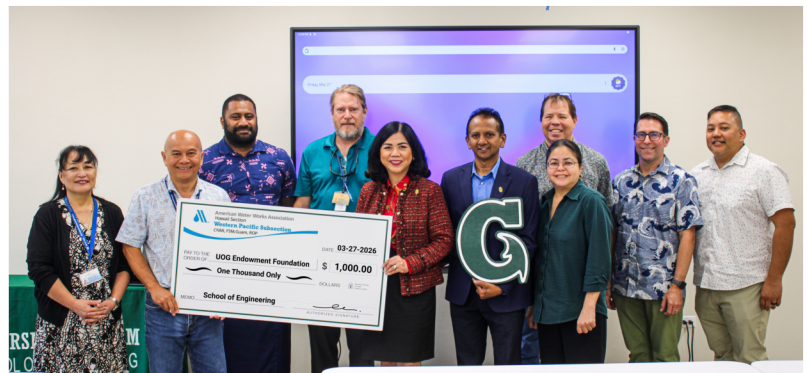
Scholarship Support Continues to Grow for University of Guam Students
